






1) <u>Curricular Activity :</u>

Conclusion:

- Overall satisfactory level of students with respect to Teaching & Learning in GIT is quite impressive and is 74 %
- A thorough survey made on random sample of 181 students indicates the categorical performance of Teaching & Learning in GIT.
- Students are highly satisfied with syllabus coverage, which is the strength of GIT.
- Other Teaching & Learning aspects are also giving remarkable satisfaction.
- To extract weak areas of individuals, more efforts on peer-to-peer interaction will lead to excellent satisfaction level and personality development of students.
- The satisfactory level of students with respect to co curricular activities in GIT is 72%, which is based on a thorough survey of random sample of 181 students.
